Oklahoma teachers press lawmakers

Capitol on Monday to press the Republican-dominated legislature to enact a capital gains tax overhaul that educators said could help end a statewide walkout now in its

During a rally filled with live music and speeches, the teachers called for increased spending for an education system where inflation-adjusted funding per student dropped by 28.2 percent between 2008 and 2018, the biggest reduction of any state, according to the nonpartisan Center on Budget and Policy Priorities.

"We are asking them to fully fund the future and create sustained revenue," said Jenni Morrison, 37, a teacher from Edmond who has been at the Capitol every day since the strike began on April 2. Public schools serving about 500,000 of the state's 700,000 students were closed on

Monday. That includes Oklahoma City and Tulsa, which said they would close again
